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# **Course Description:**

This course is a continuation of Global History I and will culminate with the New York State Regents Examination at the end of the year. The focus of this class will be on the development of the modern world from The Age of Absolutism to the present. Concepts such as revolution, imperialism, nationalism, socialism, communism, democracy, and war in the Western and Non-Western world will be studied.

The work that you do in this class will be both interesting and challenging. We will be working together to continue developing your methods for analyzing both primary and secondary sources, your research and writing skills, and to enhance your comprehension of history. It is extremely important for you to keep an organized notebook/binder. Students are given the opportunity to excel. It is up to you to be a dedicated and responsible student.
