# We the People

## Article I

Section 1. All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 2. The House of Representatives shall be composed of the People chosen every second Year, who shall have at least seven Years, and who shall, when elected, be at least twenty one Years of Age; who, when elected, shall have seven Years Residence within that State in which they shall be chosen; and who, when elected, shall have been seven Years Citizens of the United States, and who, when elected, shall have been seven Years Citizens of that State in which they shall be chosen. The House of Representatives shall have the sole Power of Impeachment.

Section 3. The Senate of the United States shall be composed of two Senators from each State, chosen by the Legislature thereof, for a Term of six Years; and each Senator shall have at least thirty Years of Age, and seven Years Residence within that State in which he shall be chosen. The Senate shall have the sole Power to try all Impeachments, when called on to do so, and to determine the Sentence in all Cases of Impeachment; but no Sentence of Death or banishment shall be inflicted in any Case of Impeachment. The Senate shall have the Power to fill all Vacancies that may happen in the Senate, by choosing one or more Senators, who shall hold Office until the next Meeting of the Legislature.

Section 4. The Times, Places and Manner of holding the Elections of Senators and Representatives, shall be prescribed in each State by the Legislature thereof; but the Congress may at any time by Law alter or change in any or in all of those Things the Times, Places and Manner of holding such Elections, provided they make no Change in the Times, Places and Manner of holding the Elections of Senators and Representatives, which shall have no Effect.
