The Parent-Student Portal has been closed for the past few weeks, as we roll over our systems from the previous school year. It will be reopened on or about Monday, August 29.


Remember that the format of the Student -Guardian Email logins has changed from last year. Instead of firstname.lastname@stfrancisprep.org, it is now studentnumber@stfrancisprep.org (and g-studentnumber@stfrancisprep.org for the Guardian email accounts). Note that your password should be unchanged. If you are new to the school, you will be receiving your student number and password information before classes start during orientation.

If you have questions or issues regarding Student- Parent Portal access or Student -Guardian Email Accounts, please start by visiting the SFP Tech Help portion of our website. It can be accessed by clicking on the button "SFP Tech Help," just below the Parent Portal button on the right side of the Prep home page. Walk-a-thon

On Friday, September 30th, St. Francis Prep will host its sixth annual Walk-a-thon fundraising event. The proceeds of this event will benefit special projects and programs at the Prep, most notably the current Capital Improvement and Modernization Project. As you know, we already constructed new **Physical Education** and **Art Education** Centers and totally overhauled the **Science Classrooms** and **Laboratories**. Additional phases of this modernization program will continue over the next several years, with the construction of new **Music Education facilities** now underway.



This Annual Walk-a-thon fundraising event is very important as we plan for the Prep's financial future and ensure that we are always providing our students with an outstanding education in the Franciscan tradition. With this in mind, we want to bring to your attention the following important information about the Walk-a-thon event on September 30th. This will be a regular school day. Students will come in for a required extended COR beginning at 8:30 AM, and then proceed outside for the event with their COR at the appropriate time with their teacher in charge.

Every student is expected to participate. Just like last year, each student is **required to secure at least \$100 in sponsorships** from family members, friends, neighbors, or local businesses.

ponsorships can be as little as \$10 each—and sponsors will receive a commemorative decal and will be recognized by their giving level. Once again, there will be a competition among the students for the highest sponsorship total by a Freshman, Sophomore, Junior, and Senior COR. In addition, all students who secure \$200 or more, \$300 or more, and \$500 or more in sponsorships by September 23rd will be entered into 3 drawings to win special prizes. There will also be a grand prize awarded to the top overall fundraising student.

Please note: students and families who do not secure the required \$100 in Walk-a-thon sponsorships must provide the difference to St. Francis Prep. It will be added to the January tuition bill.

Every student will be required to return to the classroom with his/her COR at the conclusion of the Walk-a-thon. Bottled water and snack items will be available. **Attendance will be taken again!** The prize winners will be announced, and everyone will then be dismissed at approximately 11:45 AM. The Walk-a-thon Permission Form (which must be returned to the student's Cor by September 23rd) and copies of a Sponsorship Form to be used by the students when they secure their sponsors can be downloaded by going to **www.steps4prep.org**.

Kenyan Exchange Program

For two weeks in July, Mrs. Ellen Schuler, Mathematics teacher, Mr. Ed Woods, '73, Director of Technology, Dr. Christian Sullivan, Director of Campus Ministry, and dentists, Dr. Joseph Pantaleo, '03, and Dr. Meredith Gantos visited our twin school in Lare, Kenya. Their mission was to deepen our relationship and cooperation with St. Francis Secondary School through the newly established Kenyan Exchange Program.



Each day the team learned about a different component of Kenyan culture, the Diocese of Nakuru, the educational and medical systems, and daily life for the students and staff at St. Francis Secondary School. Our visiting dentists spent several days providing dental education and screenings to the students and staff. Schuler, Sullivan, and Woods, observed classes, dialogued with faculty members, visited local public and Catholic feeder schools, and answered endless questions about SFP, New York, and the United States.
