The major strength of our program is that we offer a great combination of a strong academic core curriculum and the opportunity to take advanced or specialized courses in your areas of interest and strength. Our program is designed to give you a full, rich, and well-rounded education.

At St. Francis Prep, we do not track students. A student may be in one, several, or no honors classes, based on background, qualification, interest, and choice. Enrollment in and qualification for honors classes is based solely on a student's performance in his or her class work at St. Francis Prep. We have many students who are in several Advanced Placement classes in junior and senior years who were not in any honors classes in freshman or sophomore year.

Because we do not track students, not being in an honors course one year does not prevent you from enrolling in an honors course for the following year. From year to year, we have much movement into and out of honors classes. As you look at the courses offered in each department, please know you have the ability to move into advanced work from year to year.

Our program rewards your hard work and allows you to pursue advanced work in areas that interest you and are your strength. The flexibility of our program distinguishes it from honors programs in other schools.

The study of World Language requires a developmental approach and implies a progressive acquisition of linguistic skill. The values gained from learning a language will be relate to the amount of time and effort devoted to it. The study of another language brings about a gradually expanding and deepening knowledge of the country, people, geography, history, social institutions, and culture of the people who speak that particular language. As a result, our students acquire a better perspective of our own culture.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

■ Language Clubs: There are over 15 clubs dedicated to various cultures of the world (and our school), including those whos languages are offered by our department.

■ World Language Honor Society: A ceremony is held to recognize students who have shown academic achievement in their study of the second language. Students recognized have obtained high academic standing maintaining a 94% average in three years of the language course studied. In addition, students are being commended by their language teachers for sincere interest and enthusiasm for language learning, appreciation for other cultures, being open-minded

and accepting of cultural differences, respecting the rights and dignity of all people and putting forth his/her best in language study.

■ Yearly Education Trips with the World Language Department: Recent international school trips include: France, Italy, Spain, Greece, Germany, Austria, Switzerland, London, Liechtenstein, Slovenia, Croatia, Portugal, and Costa Rica. Yearly Educational Trips with World Language can also be considered a half credit course

■ Educational Students Exchange Program: We offer a unique German/American Cultural and Educational Student Exchange Program, giving many of our students the opportunity to experience daily life in another country. We anticipate an exchange program with Italy and Spain in the near future.

■ In June of 2022 The World Language department received accreditation from Middle States for its excellence in the World Language program and for maintaining its standard in alignment with FLACS (Foreign Language Association of Chairpersons and Supervisors) and to the requirements of New York State.

■ The World Language assists with coordinating International night, a chance for students, faculty, staff, and community to experience diversity, try ethnic food, and learn about different countries.

■ Societies: Our World Language teachers belong to the following societies: AASTP, AATI, LILT, and OSI.

■ National Exams: Students compete in the National Exam for Spanish, Italian, and French. Medals and certificates are distributed according to the following cut-scores:
Gold Medal: 90-100 percentile
Silver Medal: 80-89 percentile
Bronze Medal: 70-79 percentile

Guidance Department

The Guidance Department at St. Francis Prep is a team that offers our young men and women every opportunity to excel and navigate optimally through their high school years. As school counselors, we have the professional responsibility to bring our influence to bear on a school system's efforts to promote maximum student growth. School counselors are trained to focus on the needs and welfare of students and their families and to sharpen that focus; we rely on our personal relationships. Besides learning to thrive in an academic environment, our students are challenged with making decisions on academic and personal levels.

College planning can be full of anxiety and high expectations for the future, and we assist and guide our students through this process and keep parents informed of all activities, deadlines, and scholarship opportunities. The counselors work and remain with their individual students from 9th through 12th grades, truly getting to know their specific needs and desires, always making educated decisions about the next phase of their education.

Mathematics Department

The Members of the Mathematics Department here at St. Francis Preparatory strive to make their teaching methods and use of technology relevant and effective.

The Curriculum taught is the New York State mandated courses of Algebra, Geometry and Algebra 2. Within this curriculum we offer honors and regular Regents courses. There is a Mathematics Curriculum that addresses the needs of students who have consistently encountered problems in learning Mathematics. This curriculum offers a four-year journey in Mathematics that will enable the young person to achieve success with numbers. Beyond Algebra 2, we offer elective courses which can be taken for college credit. These courses include A.P. Calculus AB (A.P. Calculus BC if there are qualified students), Calculus Honors, Probability and Statistics, Math Analysis Honors, Precalculus, and Math 12. In the near future, we will be offering A.P. Statistics for qualified students. As a faculty, we recommend all students study a fourth year of Mathematics. The aforementioned elective courses are offered to accommodate all levels of mathematical ability.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

- All students are required to purchase a T.I.84CE Calculator which will be used for four years.
- All of the elective courses can be taken for college credit.

- Acceptance into all honors courses and elective courses have specific requirements.

- Mu Alpha Theta is the National Mathematics Honor Society that eligible students can join in their junior and senior year. Students are required to do service hours tutoring fellow students.

- We offer a variety of peer tutoring services and the Math Center is available to the students during the school day. The faculty offer extra help before and/or after school.

The Music Department strives to ensure the education of the whole student through the great vocation of Music. This is accomplished through community-centered learning environments, as well as varied and enjoyable performance opportunities. These range from participating in countless school functions, to international tours, to high-level performances for dignitaries such as Popes John Paul II and Benedict XVI. Prep's Music department offers eleven level-appropriate performing ensembles for academic credit. Courses are also available in Music Theory, Music History, Electronic Orchestration (Finale), and Technology (Logic). Most recently, Prep now offers a composition program to our most accomplished students (by invitation).

Prep also offers a free Music Lesson program for academic credit, and provides outreach opportunities in the Queens community.

We are the inaugural school to earn the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools Program of Distinction in Music, a worldwide first. In 2018, we became the first ever to be renewed as a Program of Distinction in Music from the Middle States Association.

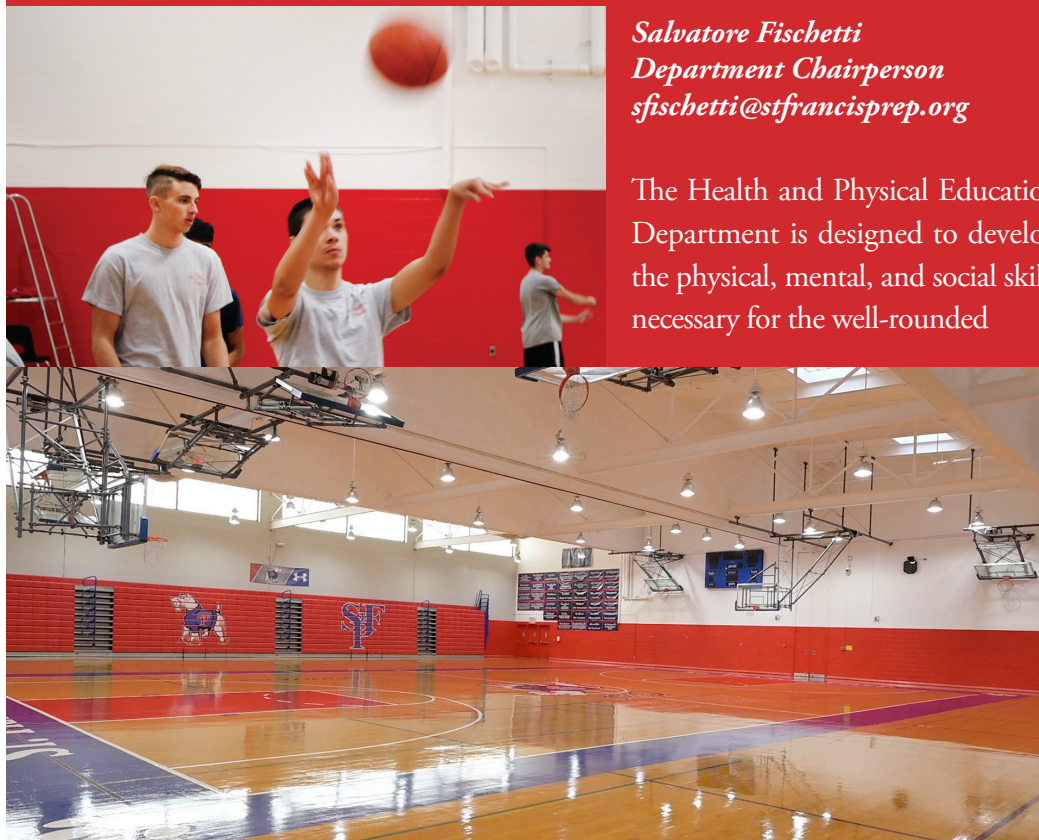

The Religious Education program at St. Francis Prep is designed to provide the opportunity for students to grow in faith and acquire knowledge of themselves, God and others. Our courses immerse students in our Franciscan and Catholic Christian traditions, with a deep interest in addressing the developmental and faith needs of the adolescent.

FRESHMAN & SOPHOMORE YEAR

The first and second years of our program are foundational. Students

will explore the call of the prophets, the life of Jesus, the roots of Christianity and the Church. The lives of the saints—especially our patron St. Francis—are held up as role models for holiness and the invitation to deepen our relationship with God. Scripture, Doctrine, and the sacramental life of the Church are the basis of our focus. Together, students and teachers will also explore the development of a mature faith life as they relate to decisions facing teens and the persons they are becoming. Our Experience Group program is a vital part of this process through weekly meetings and discussions on various topics.

JUNIOR & SENIOR YEAR

During Junior and Senior Year, students may choose from a rich selection of elective courses designed to explore faith issues on a deeper level in relation to the world around us. Students will choose two semester-length courses each year, based on their areas of interest. During Junior year, qualified students may choose to take a full year of Christian Service.

Science Department

Students at St. Francis Prep can take one of many possible pathways in science education. Three main facets of science at St. Francis Prep include our integrative Advanced Physical Science course for 9th graders that provides a strong foundation for future science courses, our Advanced Placement (AP) pathway beginning early in 10th grade, and our very successful Science Research Program. In fact, We are one of the only Catholic schools in NYC to consistently produce Regeneration Science Talent Search Scholars/semi-finalists and one of very few Catholic schools in the nation to garner this distinction. In 2025, St. Francis Prep was one of the only schools in Queens to have a semi-finalist.
