In addition to all the tasks we will accomplish within each session, we have chosen the first three weeks of August as the Common Application will be live and ready for each student to complete. Once the Common Application and all other components of the application are completed, such as the essay, your child will be ready to hit the "submit" button by the start of their senior year! Each student will also be creating a CUNY I.D and a log in user name in order to start the CUNY application in their senior year. This will allow each student to simply log in and complete the application as early as September 1st.

We are offering these mini sessions over the summer for all incoming seniors in order for this special year to be one that will be missed, not forgotten. The frenzied process of college selection, filing applications and writing essays will no longer be viewed as daunting. The Symposium will allow you to get acquainted with guidance counselors, the College Office and will allow us to become familiar with your specific needs and help you prepare your college search early on in the process. This is especially imperative for students who choose early action or early decision options.
