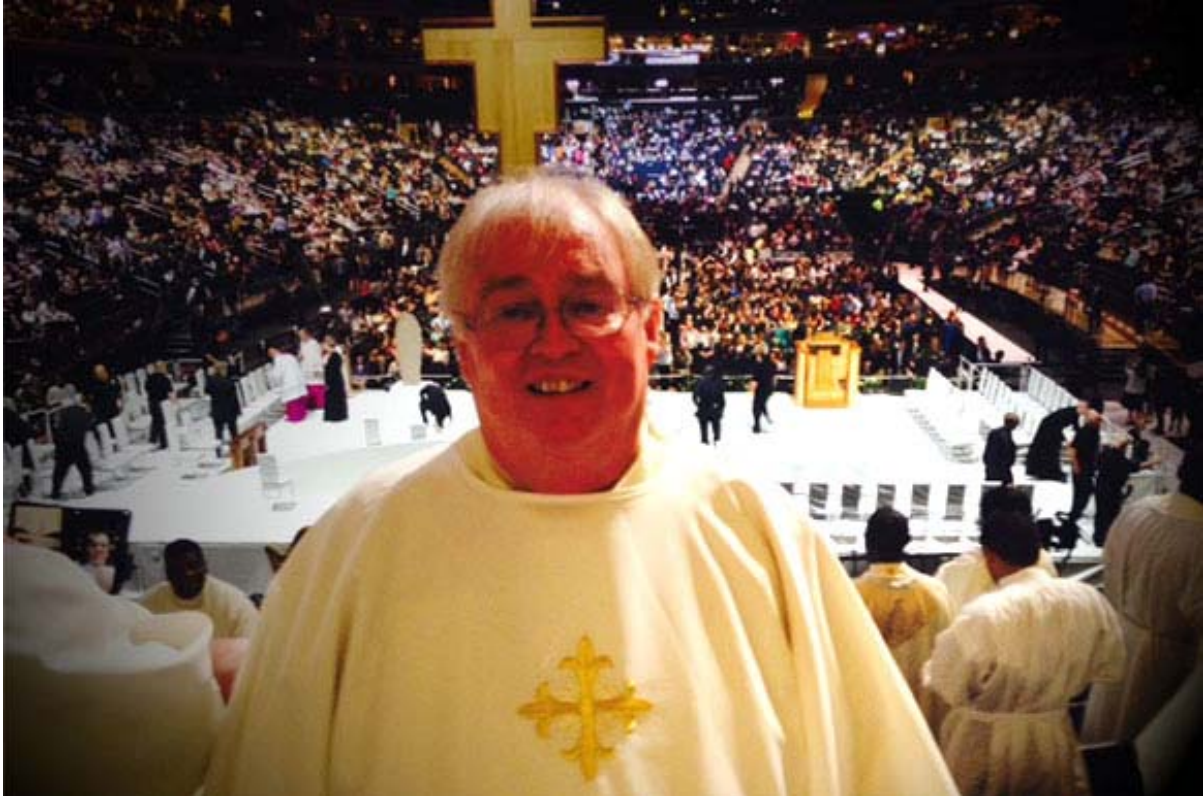
This past summer was an incredibly busy one at SFP. We continue to upgrade our facility and provide students with an enriched learning environment. We completed work on the east and west bottom corridors and continue our progress with the Music department classrooms. These improvements will benefit all of our current students in a very significant way by being engaged in their studies in 21st century facilities.

During the week of 31 August, our newest 9th-graders participated in 3 events to get them well prepared for the beginning of high school. On Monday, 31 August, 9th-graders and new transfer students came in to receive their iPads. They set up their accounts and downloaded the necessary apps.

On Tuesday, 1 September, these same students participated in our Strategies for Academic Success program. They had a brief introduction to our Franciscan values and traditions, given by Br. Joseph Bach of our Religion department. The students then went through a full day of workshops on setting up and using the iPad; they also talked about using technology with integrity. The goal of this day was to have the students come to the first day of classes feeling competent with using the iPad. While the students were in the classroom, many parents and guardians stayed in the Auditorium for an orientation to life at St. Francis Prep.

On Wednesday, 2 September, 9th-graders participated in SFP Follies – a long-standing Prep tradition. Students met the students in their Cor (homeroom), worked with senior peer counselors, went on a scavenger hunt to learn the building, and participated in a fun field events program. By the end of the day, the students were building the camaraderie and community that is so essential to their experience at St. Francis Prep. All three days were very successful.

The students received a good introduction to Franciscan values, technology, and our community. They got to meet many students and to prepare themselves for the first day of classes. These programs were successful thanks to the generosity and sacrifice of so many of our faculty members. Special thanks go to Ms. Nicole May, our iPad Coordinator, who coordinated both iPad days. We thank all administrators and faculty and staff members, particularly Mr. Castellano, who coordinated and scheduled all activities, for their commitment to the students and the school and for giving of their time to help the students to start the year well .

They walked with Mr. Gammello's company, WeiserMazars, and his family and friends. Together they raised \$6,650. Ms. Gammello and her family were touched by the outpouring of support during this difficult time and thank the Prep Community.



Paris Trip:

During the first week of July, the Art department took its first international field trip to Paris. Mrs. Buccino, Mr. Biondolillo, and Ms. Shmerykowsky, accompanied by additional chaperones Ms. Prohaska and Father Bill Sweeney, led a group of 33 students and six of their family members to the City of Light for eight days. While touring the city, the group visited many famous sites, including the Eiffel Tower, the Palais Garnier Opera House, the Arc de Triomphe on the Champs Elysee, and Notre Dame Cathedral. They also attended several of the world's most renowned museums, including the Louvre, the Picasso Museum, and the Musee D'Orsay, and some of the key tourist attractions surrounding the city, such as Disneyland Paris, the Palace of Versailles, and Monet's Gardens at Giverny.



The trip, which focused on art, was an opportunity for the students to see some of the most famous art ever created and to create some of their own. Students were encouraged to draw in the Louvre, sketch the architecture at Versailles, and attend an Impressionist painting class, to name a few things they did. The Art department hopes that this was just the first of many educational and exciting art trips in the future.

Summer Enrichment Course:

Prep students enrolled in "The Common Cents" program took a trip to the NYSE with program founder and instructor, Jim Gannon '83, in order to get a glimpse of activity on the trading floor and to better understand the securities industry. Along the way, they met a few Prep graduates and gained invaluable insight into the industry. Offered as part of Prep's Summer Academy, the "Common Cents" program is a financial literacy workshop, designed for a pre-college teenager, that focuses on teaching its participants personal finance, investment knowledge, and critical-thinking skills. The mission of the program is to simplify the complexities of the financial industry by breaking down financial concepts into easy to understand ideas. The students are exposed to numerous topics, including but not limited to personal finance, economic principles, stocks, bonds, derivatives, commodities, hedge funds, private equity, venture capital, and a history of major financial events and trends. This knowledge base provides an individual with the necessary tools to better understand the financial world and make sound decisions regarding their own personal financial future.
